The credit for creating this dual-purpose buff goose, goes to Wales. The Brecon Buff was bred from stock from Breconshire Hill farms in South Wales where it was developed by Mr Rhys Llewellyn. It was officially standardised in 1934. They are hardy, light boned with maximum flesh, an active breed and is more prolific than ultra-heavy breeds.

True Brecons have a lighter build than the American Buff and pink rather than orange beak, legs and feet.

Carriage:	Upright, alert, and active.
Type:	Broad body, well rounded and compact. Breast: round, full and round. Wings: large and strong.
Head:	Small and neat, no sign of coarseness. Eyes: bright.
Neck:	Long and thin, the throat showing no gullet.
Legs and Feet:	Legs: fairly short. Strong shanks. Toes: straight.
Plumage:	Hard and tight.
