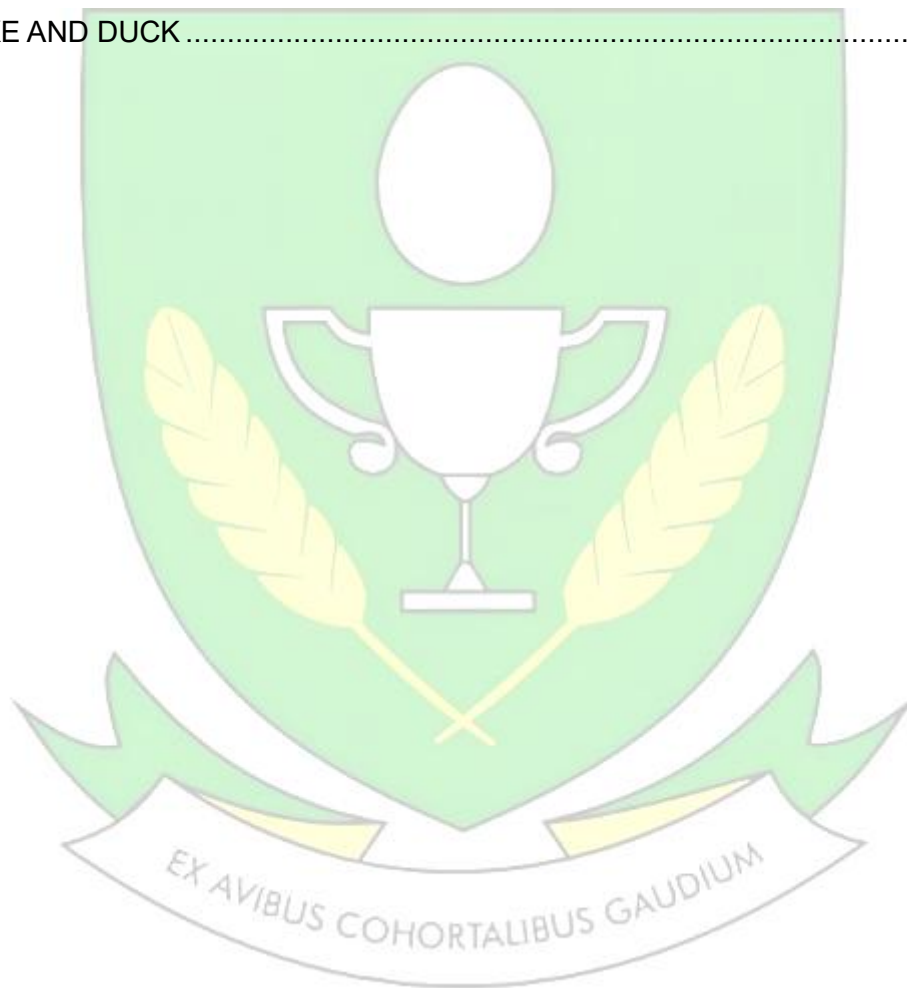

Many people think that the Cayuga was bred from the Black East Indian, but larger. The breed actually takes its name from Lake Cayuga, in New York. In 1851 black ducks appeared on the lake and specimens were sent to England.

GENERAL CHARACTERISTICS

DRAKE AND DUCK

Carriage:	Lively, clear of the ground from breast to stern.
Type:	Body: long, broad and deep. Breast: broad, full and prominent with clean underline. Tail: carried well out and closely folded, the drakes having two or three well curled feathers in the centre.
Head:	Large. Bill: flat, long and wide, well set in a straight line from the tip of the eye. Eyes: full.
Neck:	Long and tapering with a graceful curve.
Legs and Feet:	Legs: large, strong boned, placed midway in the body. Feet: straight.

DISQUALIFICATIONS

White or red feathers, orange bill, dished bill.

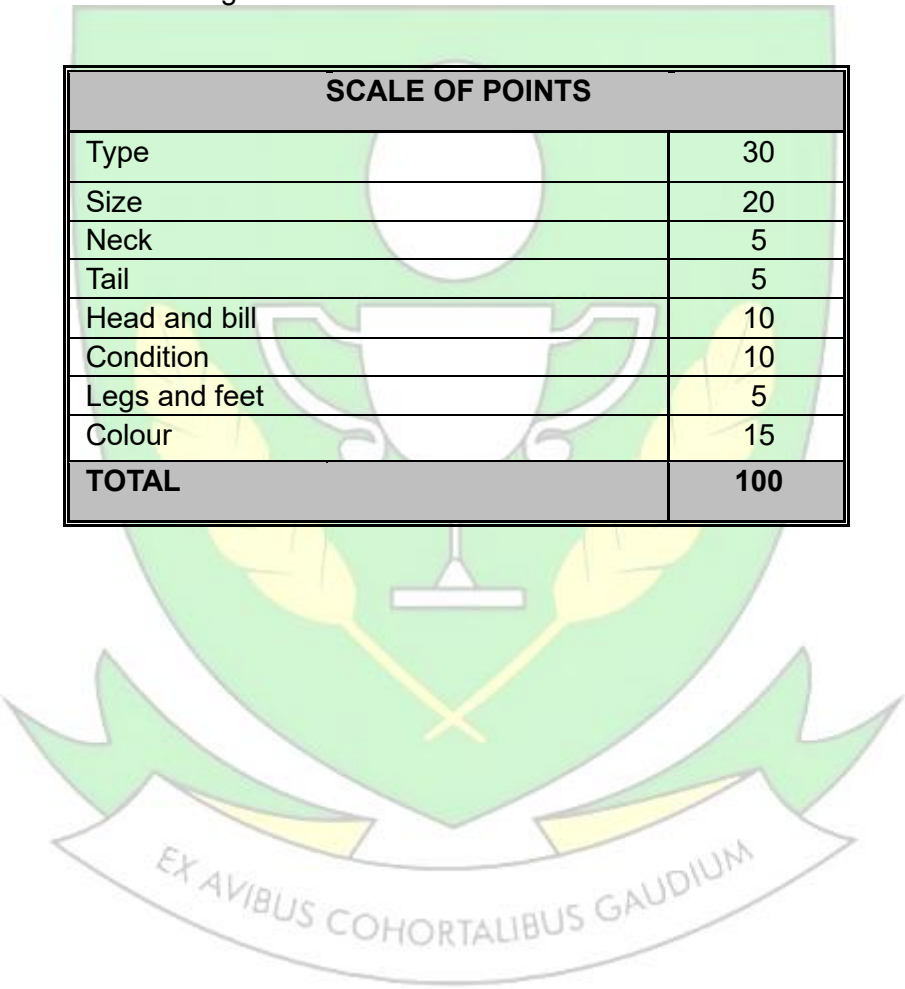
COLOUR

BLACK

DRAKE AND DUCK

Plumage: Very lustrous green black, free from purple or white, the whole of the back and upper part of wings, breast and underparts of the body, deep black, the wings naturally more lustrous than the rest of the body plumage. A brown or purple tinge is objectionable, but not a disqualification

Bill: Slate black, with dense black saddle in the centre, but not touching the sides or coming within 2.5 cm of the end. The beak: black. Eyes: black. Legs and feet: dull orange brown.
